

MLA guidelines require the Works Cited page to be arranged **alphabetically** by the author's last name (or title, if no author) and **doubled-spaced**. For organizational purposes and to save paper, those guidelines are NOT reflected here. See reverse for additional helpful tips.

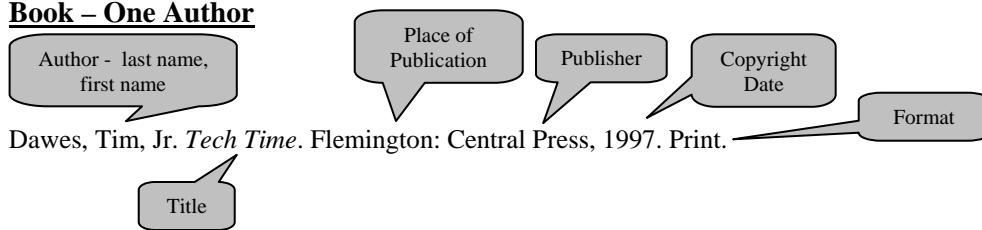

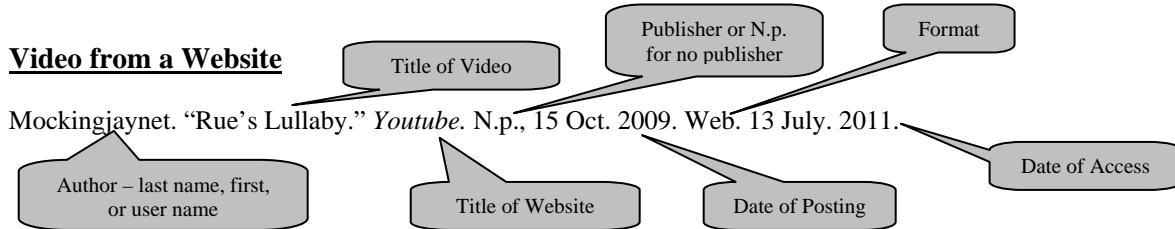

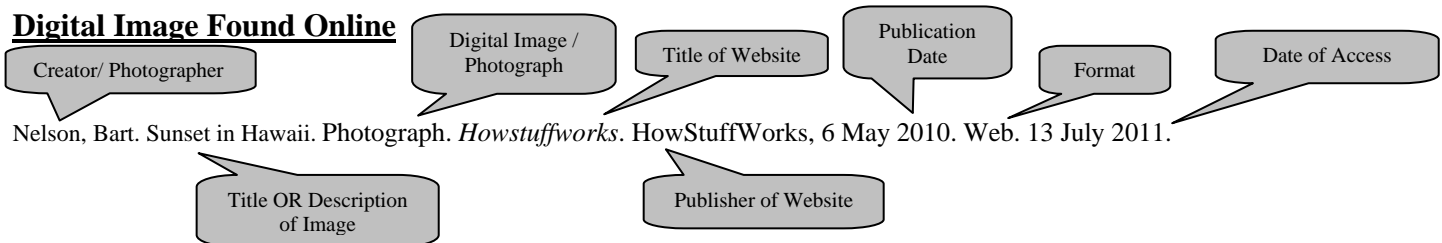
### Book – One Author



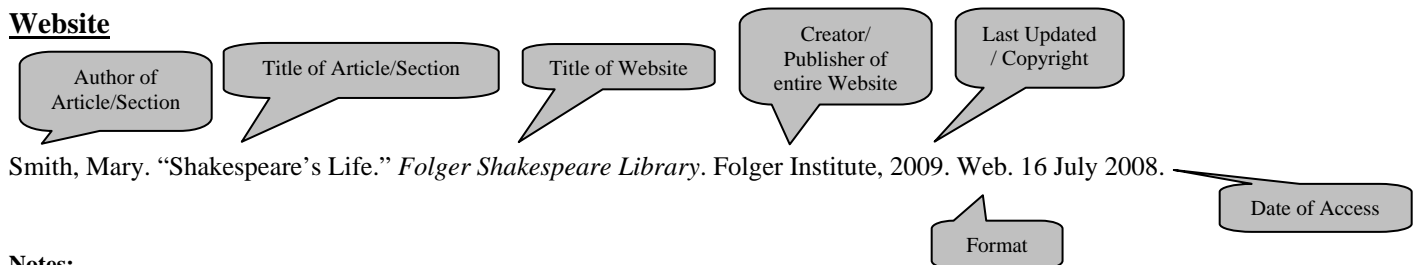
### Video from a Website

#### Notes:

- If no author is listed on the work you are citing, skip that part of the citation and begin with the title.
- For citations with **multiple authors**, follow the formats used for books.
- **Abbreviations** are **required** for missing information in **web citations**.
  - Use n.p. if no publisher or sponsor is given.
  - Use n.d. when no publication date is given.
  - Use n. pag. if no page numbers are given (for a work on the Web that also has print publication data)
